Our visiting speaker, Rhett Groom, a local cycling enthusiast, then gave a captivating and inspiring talk about his taking part in the last two Tours de France in aid of Cure Leukemia. With his team they raised over 2 million pounds to fund research in centres within the UK and Rhett gave a fascinating and emotional insight into the benefits of their fundraising.

He then decided to ride across the Andes in South America this January (as you do!) to raise more funds for children's leukemia and has been accepted to ride in the Spanish Vuelta next year for charity. His talk demonstrated sheer motivation, dedication and commitment and you could hear a pin drop in the room, such was the power of his talk.

We then had the first of a new idea Chris Barrett has introduced called "meet a member". Every member has a past and stories to tell, be they a career, hobbies, travel etc and the concept is to ask a volunteer to take part in a 5 minute fun and entertaining question and answer session to learn more about the person and their experiences. Our first "volunteer" (with slight persuasion!) was Vince O'Brien whose career was as a Contact Lens Optician.

Who knew that the concept of a contact lens was discovered by Leonardo de Vinci in 1508, the first lens was made in 1887 to medicate the eye, in 1929 a mould could be made of the eye and in 1936 a plastic lens was made, and so lenses have changed, developed and improved.

Vince advised that during his career he had been called into an operating theatre to fit lenses to a newborn baby with defective eyelids, and had also supplied lenses to a thalidomide victim with no arms who successfully inserted lenses using her toes. He also diagnosed a pregnancy via a patient's eyesight problems!

An excellent and fascinating chat and we are hugely grateful to Vince for leading the way and being the first victim! We welcome more volunteers.

Our next GA will be on Thursday 6th June at which our speaker will be Tony Grande from Make a Smile, a fantastic charity that supports vulnerable children locally and to whom the Goodwill team made a donation earlier this year.
