Speaker Tony Grande - Make a Smile

At the General Assembly in Murla on Thursday 6th June we were delighted to welcome Tony Grande from the charity "Make a Smile" as our guest speaker.

The Goodwill team had presented the charity with a 1000e donation early this year from funds raised through events and the generosity of members. Tony thanked members for this and explained it had been used to purchase summer clothing and birthday gifts for children in the Benissa children's home.

I have been fortunate to have met Tony on several occasions and heard him speak about his charity, but even so, I was humbled and in awe once again and, by the silence in the audience, it was clear members were too.

Tony explained how during the financial crisis of 2008 he was approached in his shop, the Bed Centre in Calpe, and asked if he could help to provide beds for 8 children in a home for vulnerable children in Benissa.



A DIY SOS followed asking local businesses to help repair and renovate the home as it was in a poor condition and the fantastic Costa Blanca community jumped in to help.

Money was raised to provide food for the children as they were struggling to feed them and Tony and the team were soon made aware of 98 children in 8 houses plus 26 mentally challenged young people that also needed urgent supplies, and so their charity grew.

They set up a farm to teach people life lessons such as how to grow their own food which proved to be hugely successful at the time. Sadly this has since had to close.

More recently they opened a charity shop in Teulada at the bottom of the main road to provide a regular income stream and this has also proved very successful. They would welcome volunteers to help in the shop, donations of goods to sell and shoppers! Like all charities, income is critical and they are immensely grateful for donations from organisations and individuals to be able to continue and expand the amazing work they do.

Tony explained children must leave the homes when they reach the age of 18 but they work with them to try find jobs and somewhere safe to live so they are not abandoned and at risk.

Members had lots of questions and were interested in the albums Tony had to show about the work Make a Smile does.

We thanked Tony for his and the charity's amazing contribution to the community and it is an honour to be able to support them.

Everyone was advised to bring plenty of water, at least one litre each. The pace was slower than usual, and we looked for shaded areas to have our many water stops. We also had to find shaded, rather than sunny, areas for our picnic stop. We found that even though the daily temperatures might be 30c plus, it was usually much lower before midday.



He was incredibly talented, generous with his time and love, loved life to the full and excelled in all he did.

An accomplished sailor, an excellent cook, a brilliant musician, a sincere friend and family man and truly inspirational to keep on singing and playing for charity until the end.

To round off a wonderful celebration we followed Tony's explicit instructions and a group of close friends and family partied on the terrace of his and Sandie's home until late into the evening, enjoying wonderful food and champagne and toasting a very special friend.

Our love and thoughts go to his wife, Sandie, also a very dear friend of ours, and to the OKs. In true friendship his former band mates and close friends, Orlando, Marlis and Rockit, and Elena and Alain from Multipass, have kindly taken over the gig for us on 7/6. It will be an emotional occasion for us all but Tony would have wanted the show to go on.

The Power of Community & Charity

I wanted to share a very recent story that demonstrates the amazing community we live in and the power that charities can have.

I was recently made aware of a lady living rough within our community with hardly any money and struggling daily. She lived in fear of being discovered by the authorities who are aware of her and have moved her on several times, although one member of the Guardia Civil very kindly took her a meal on Christmas Day. Social services cannot assist her.

Can you imagine living without water, a bathroom, a kitchen, electricity, a fridge, fans or air con, a proper bed etc, being bitten alive by mosquitos and setting rat traps to keep them away from what food you have?

She lives in constant fear of the wild boar, rats and snakes around her and of being discovered. I am not brave when it comes to rats or snakes (I am terrified) but I put my big girl pants on and went to find her and I was horrified at the conditions she was living in and had been for many months.

I could help with food, transport etc but I needed professional help so I called my dear friend,
Arne Soeten, President of Project 4 All and simply said "I need help"

Members may recall the Goodwill team donated to P4A earlier in the year and Arne attended a General Assembly to talk about their work supporting the homeless.

10 minutes later we were on our way and after chatting with her, Arne amazingly agreed to give her a home in his ladies' refuge. What an absolute hero.

To say she was speechless and grateful is an understatement. But to see her face light up when he gave her an "Arne bear hug", he's a big guy and very generous with his hugs, was a delight.

She said she hadn't been hugged for years.

He arranged for her to move in within 24/48 hours and we will ensure she has new clothes and bedding to start her new life.

We are blessed to have such wonderful people and charities in our small community and to be able to raise money to support the fantastic work they all do.

Thank you to everyone who supports the Goodwill team in any way. Each year we select charities to benefit from our fundraising so they can continue their work in our community.

World Wildlife Fund Espana - Remembering

Few of us would be able to say we've gone through life to date without losing a much loved someone in our lives. Individually and as family we all have different ways of remembering, indeed, celebrating that special someone. Alan and I as a couple had our own views on that and I followed his wishes after he died in September 2021.

I've made it clear to my distant family that I too want the lowest key fuss after my demise, that's how Alan and I wanted it and having enjoyed decades loving our lives here in Spain, the idea of having a memorial that supported the wildlife and natural spaces that we long admired, seemed ideal.

A leaflet from the WORLD WILDLIFE FUND, promoting the many ways in which we as individuals, or groups, can help fund their work, and especially here in Spain, through WWF España gave me an opportunity to do just that.

Planting a Memorial Tree, in the name of a loved one, was my choice to have a permanent marker celebrating Alan's life here. This particular project is in a wood near RIAZA south of Segovia, is a special area for the rescue and protection of birds of prey, raptors and a migratory route for the majestic Griffin Vulture.

Indeed the idea appealed so much, that months later I asked if I too could have a tree, next to Alan, in my name. Bárbara and WWF España in Madrid were happy to arrange that for me.

Doesn't have to be a memorial, of course, celebrate and mark happier occasions within your own families. A special milestone birthday, a new grandchild, graduating from UNI.

Adopting an animal that WWF España are working to save for these future generations.

A gift in your WILL, towards ensuring that the younger generation will inherit and appreciate the wonders of nature and wildlife that we've been privileged to enjoy.


