### Valencia Bike Update

You may be aware we recently responded to an SOS for bikes for Valencia to help those people who have lost everything start to get mobile again. Children needed them to get to school, adults to get to work and volunteers to get around. Over 120,000 cars were destroyed in the floods plus bikes, motorbikes, scooters etc.

When the appeal started there was a waiting list of 300 people. A team had set up a workshop and were ready to fix them up, sort out tyres and gears, oil them and make sure they were safe. They then matched bikes to riders and supplied donated helmets, lights etc.

We asked members and friends to donate any unwanted bikes and, as always, you came up trumps . We hoped to get a few, but Chris and I collected 37 bikes!!!! and delivered them to a halfway house in Jesus Pobre from where vans and lorries took them to Valencia.

The response was amazing and we cannot thank everyone who donated to this very worthy cause enough and also those who spread the word. In total over 311 bikes left Jesus Pobre for Valencia

What an achievement and to think, all were sat in sheds and garages not being ridden! I guess we all had good intentions but age and health decreed otherwise!

I wanted to share just a couple of responses with you to show how valuable your support is. It certainly is humbling.
