Jalon man trailing search and rescue team



At our February General Assembly we enjoyed a very interesting talk by Muriel who set up and leads the Jalon man trailing search and rescue team. They are one of the organisations the Goodwill team made a donation to recently to purchase much needed equipment. She was accompanied by several members of the rescue team and their gorgeous dogs who were all incredibly well behaved in such a busy environment.

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Muriel is a fully qualified search and rescue handler and trainer and has worked in this field in many countries in Europe and in South Africa. She also took an internship in the US and chooses to be involved because of her love of dogs.

Muriel explained that a successful man trailing dog must have the nose for it but also a strong drive. Dogs have a sense of smell that is 100,000 times better than humans and respond to our individual smell and the skin cells that we shed. A much larger part of their brain also controls their sense of smell and they can smell in much greater detail than humans.

Once provided with an article belonging to a missing person they can work inside, outside, in crowds, in buildings, in all terrains and even take the scent of a person from the body of another person, for example in the case of rape victims.

All types of dogs can become trailing dogs provided they are keen to work.

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They wear a harness and long lead when working and are in control of the search.

Their handler, with whom they must have a strong bond, gives them free rein and the human follows, interpreting the signs the dog gives.

Each dog signs in a different way and respond to different rewards, some work for food, some for toys.

Muriel explained that external factors must be taken into account including temperature, humidity, wind, obstacles and water which can affect the ability to track successfully.

Best times are early morning and just before sunset when the humidity is optimum and it is not too hot as warm air rises and takes the scent with it.

Also the dogs cannot work in excessive heat. Given the right conditions she has managed a 100% success rate in finding persons.



Muriel extended an invitation to members to join the team on their Sunday morning training exercises where you see them at work and can hide and hope to be found!

A fascinating talk and comforting to know that should we ever get lost the police can call upon the team to help find us. We are very grateful for the team members for giving up their time and bringing their beautiful dogs to visit us. As a crazy dog lover cuddling Muriel's stunning Belgian shepherd pup throughout the presentation was heaven!

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5-Minute Guide to Avoiding Internet Scams

The internet is a wonderful tool, but scammers are constantly coming up with new ways to trick people. For them it is an industry. They target thousands of people via mailing lists and other sources. If only a few fall for their tricks, it is still worth their time and effort.

We are aware that some of our members may be reluctant to use our website or Facebook precisely because of these concerns. Today therefore we will share five key tips to help you avoid internet and phone scams.

1. Think Before You Click

Scammers often send emails or messages that look like they're from a trusted company, like your bank or a delivery service. These messages may ask you to click a link to "verify your account" or "claim a prize" or ask you to pay a small amount of money to take delivery of a package. However, the amount of money is not what matters to them at this stage. What they are really after is access to your bank account details.

It is generally best to delete and ignore such messages. Otherwise: Check the sender's email address – Scammers use addresses that look real but may have extra letters or numbers.

Look for spelling mistakes – A real company won't send messages with bad grammar. When in doubt, go directly to the official website by typing the web address yourself.

Another popular favourite is a message from a supposed family member or friend who is travelling and lost all their money and papers and needs you to send some money to help them out. Here the scammers have accessed the individual's computer or email and are now messaging everyone on the list of contacts. Once again even if only one or two people respond it can be worth their effort.



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2. Never Share Personal Information

No bank, government agency, or trusted company will ever ask for your password, Social Security number, or banking details by email, phone, or text. If someone asks for this information:

Hang up the phone if it's a call.

Delete the email if it's a message.

Call the company directly using a trusted phone number to check if it's real and inform them of the attempted fraud.

3. Be Wary of "Too Good to Be True" Offers

If you see an online deal that seems unbelievably cheap, or if you get an email saying you won a lottery or inheritance you never entered—it's a scam.

Avoid clicking on ads promising miracle cures, free money, or big prizes.

If a deal seems suspicious, research it first—search for the company name plus the word "scam" online.

4. Watch Out for Fake Phone Calls and Pop-Ups

Some scammers pretend to be working for the IT support or helpdesk at companies like Microsoft or Apple, telling you that your computer has a virus. They'll ask you to download software or give them remote access to "fix" it.

Never give control of your computer to a stranger.

If you see a pop-up warning about a virus, ignore it-real companies don't send messages like that.

5. Protect Your Passwords and Accounts

Strong passwords help keep your accounts safe:

Use a mix of letters, numbers, and symbols.

Never reuse the same password for multiple accounts.

Consider writing passwords in a safe place.

Enable two-factor authentication (where a code is sent to your phone) for extra security.


Final Reminder: If You're Unsure, Ask for Help

If something feels suspicious, talk to a trusted friend, family member, or your bank before taking action. Scammers want to rush you into making a mistake-don't let them!

Stay safe, trust your instincts, and remember: if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!

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NOLOTIL



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Press coverage of tragic deaths associated to the drug Nolotil/Metamizole really concerns all of us.

If you are in the unfortunate situation where you require strong painkillers, whether prescribed by your local doctor, clinic or hospital, you need to know this. Please be aware and make sure you are not prescribed either of these widely used drugs. They can have serious side effects, which seem to manifest themselves amongst Anglo Saxons/Northern Europeans including us Brits.

Over the last few years a Spanish medical translator has been fiercely campaigning to have the drug banned in Spain as it is in the UK, USA and many more countries. The tragic case histories make frightening reading: horrific side effects, organ failure, loss of white blood cells, sepsis, gangrene, amputations and permanent disability are documented side effects of Nolotil associated with these victims and a number of tragic deaths, all of which could have and should have been avoided!

Denia Hospital issued several years ago ADVICE against NOLOTIL being precribed for Anglo Saxons. Only advising, not prohibiting, and with the pressure of work and staff turnover this advice may not always be heeded.

We know of one of our own Members, fortunately aware of Nolotil's deadly reputation, who had refused it in the hospital but then picked it up on her discharge post op painkiller prescription. FOR YOUR SAKE Make sure you are aware of what you are being administered or prescribed under medical care. Query it and avoid it.

It can also appear as METAMIZOLE, a post-op painkiller. This is NOLOTIL under another name. The medical governing body, whose job it is to decide whether there is a case to ban NOLOTIL, as has already happened in 40 other countries, are still reviewing evidence. Meantime we all need to take responsibility too and make sure that we don't become part of that evidence.

Brigid, our Friendship and Support leader, is trying to source bracelets to wear in hospital stating you cannot take these drugs. Tell them you are allergic to it every time you are asked or have painkillers prescribed.


